She succumbed to cervical cancer and thereafter served as an inspiration for Menish's career change from NBC television morning anchor to benefit auctioneer. After attending a Scripps Cancer fundraiser and serving as an emcee and auctioneer voluntarily for various charities, he developed an excellent reputation. A friend convinced him this was his true calling, and being a life learner (his phrase), he graduated from the Worldwide College of Auctioneering with certificates in both Auctioneering and Bi-lingual/ Spanish Auctioneering.

Currently, Bill serves on several boards: The Scripps Hospital Stevens Cancer Center, The American Red Cross and the San Diego Center for Children. Continuing as a life learner, Menish recently graduated from the AARE (Accredited Auctioneer Real Estate) and can add that distinction to his numerous awards and accolades.
